

# Comet

Beanie, scarf and bag



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## Quality:

Comet (Gründl)

92 % Polyacryl, 8 % Wolle

50 g / 30 m

## Size:

Beanie: Head circumference approx. approx. 54 cm – 58 cm

Scarf: approx. 23 cm x 180 cm

Bag: approx. 26 cm x 22 cm (without handles)

## Required quantity:

Beanie: 150 g

Scarf: 450 g (for fringes you will need approx. an additional 50 – 100 g)

Bag: 400 g, 1 button Ø approx. 5 – 6 cm

## Needle thickness:

Beanie: Circular knitting needle 10.0 – 12.0

Scarf: Circular knitting needle 15.0

Bag: Crochet need 6.0 – 7.0

## Pattern:

### Beanie and scarf:

large seed stitch :

1st r: k 1, p 1 alternating

2nd and 4th r: Knit stitches as they appear

3rd r: p 1, k 1 alternating

repeat 1st – 4th row

Border pattern:

RSR.: k 1, p 1 alternating

WSR.: Knit st as they appear

Edge stitches:

At the beginning of the row slip stitch knitwise, k at the end of the row

### Bag:

sc in continuous rounds: only stitch into rear st

sc in RSR and WSR.: in the RSR stitch into the rear st, in the WSR into the front st

## Tension:

Large seed stitch:

with needle 10.0 – 12.0: 10 st x 12 r = 10 cm x 10 cm

with needle 15.0: 9 st x 10 r = 10 cm x 10 cm

sc: 12 st x 12 r/rd. = 10 cm x 10 cm

## Pattern:

This beanie is knitted open RSR and WSR. Cast 34 st plus 2 est, starts with 1 WSR and knit 8 r in border pattern. In the 9th r knit all p, increase 17 st evenly, 2 st 1 p through back of loop from the cross stitch = 53 st. Continue to work in large seed stitch, starting at the 28th row work decreases from cast as follows:

28th r: purl together every 6th, 7th and 8th st (always include est) as per pattern = 41 st

30th r: purl together the 5th, 6th and 7th st and every further 4th, 5th and 6th st as per pattern = 29 st

32nd r: purl together the 5th, 6th and 7th st and every further 2nd, 3rd and 4th st as per pattern = 17 st

34th r: after the est knit together 2 st = 9 st

Cut off the working thread, pull through the stitch and pull the hat up. Close the back seam flat and carefully sew all threads.

For the scarf cast 21 s and 2 est and knit approx. 180 cm (= 179 r) in large seed stitch, bind off all st straight, continue seed stitch. Sew up all threads carefully. If desired, add fringes to the ends. For the fringes, you will approx. need an additional 50 g – 100 g.

The bag is very tightly crocheted. This gives it more stability and you do not have to add any lining. Cast on 23 ch plus 1 ch as replacement for the 1st cs. Crochet the following 21 ch each with 1 sc, crochet the 1st sc in the 3rd ch from needle, crochet 5 sc in the last ch. Mark the center one of these 5 sc as rounding start and side center. Crochet the other side of the ch cast with 21 sc, crochet 4 sc in the last ch, mark the 3rd of these 4 sc as side center (= 52 st after the 1st r.). Continue working in continuous rows, increase in the 2nd to 4th r on both sides the marked st by 1 st, by crocheting each 2 sc in 1 st of the previous round (=4 increases per r. = 64 st). Crochet the 5th to 25th r without any increases. End the following r 5 st before the side marking and crochet the 1st half of the bag handle open first, crochet over 15 st in RSR and WSR. Each r sc starts with 1 ch as replacement for the 1st sc. For the bevel on the inner side of the bag handle decrease in the 3rd r (= RSR) on both side 1 st each, by putting together both sc after the replacement ch at the beginning of the row and both st before the last st at the end of the row (= 13 st). Repeat these decreases 3 times in each 2nd r (= 7 st). Crochet in continuous rounds via these 7 st approx. 45 cm (= 52 r.). Work the 2nd half of the bag handle on the opposite side in the exact same manner. For the closing latch, crochet the center 11 st of the backward bag upper edge with 11 sc. Crochet RSR and WSR approx. 12 cm (= 14 r). Add a buttonhole in the 15th r as follows: 1 ch, 1 sc, skip the following 7 st with 7 ch, 2 sc Crochet 1 r sc, and crochet the 7 center sc around the ch of the prev. r. Fit a button on the front side of the bag that goes with the buttonhole. Sew the two bag handle halves together and carefully sew all thread together.

ri = right • le = left • st = stitch • r = row • rd. = round • RSR = right-side row • WSR = wrong-side row • est = edge stitch • rep. = repeat • k tog = knit together • sc = single crochet • ch = chain stitch • i.e. = in every
